Race to the Top General Assurances  
LEA and RESA Grants for Math and ELA Summer Institute

As a condition of receiving Race to the Top (RT3) federal funds to reimburse the costs of participating in the Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE) RT3 Mathematics and English Language Arts Summer Institute, the local education agency (LEA) and Regional Educational Service Agencies (RESAs) must agree to the assurances listed below. The assurances are consistent with the allocation of federal funds under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) and the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA).

The LEA agrees to the following:

- The grant period for the Mathematics and ELA grants is January 16, 2014 – September 23, 2014. Funds will expire on September 23, 2014, and will not be available for carryover. A completion report must be submitted in GAORS not later than October 23, 2014.
- Funds must be used to pay stipends to teachers attending the summer institutes and to pay for any other institute travel related costs, including lodging and mileage. Remaining funds may be used to pay substitutes and to purchase additional resources to support the Standards and Assessment RT3 reform area.
- The LEA certifies that first priority must be to reimburse costs to teachers attending the institutes, including paying stipends to participating teachers.
- The LEA certifies that it will fully engage in the Mathematics and ELA Summer Institutes, including naming a primary contact person and other participants to attend the institutes, responding promptly to data requests, and budgeting funds to cover activities for the grant cycle of the project.

The RESA agrees to the following:

- The grant period for the Mathematics and ELA grants is January 16, 2014 – September 23, 2014. Funds will expire on September 23, 2014, and will not be available for carryover.
- Funds must be used to pay stipends to staff attending the summer institutes and to pay for any other institute travel related costs, including lodging and mileage. Remaining funds may be used to pay costs associated with supporting local school districts, including facilitating meetings, contracting with experts, attending other related conferences, and purchasing additional resources to support the Standards and Assessment RT3 reform area.
- The RESA certifies that first priority must be to reimburse costs to staff attending the institutes.
- The RESA certifies that it will fully engage in the Mathematics and ELA Summer Institutes, including naming a primary contact person and other participants to attend the institutes, responding promptly to data requests, and budgeting funds to cover activities for the grant cycle of the project.

The LEA and RESA agree to the following:

- The LEA/RESA will use such fiscal control and fund accounting procedures as will ensure proper disbursement of, and accounting for, federal and state funds paid to the LEA/RESA.
- The LEA/RESA will make reports to GaDOE as may be necessary to comply with the 1512 reporting requirements in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA).
- In accordance with Part 85 of 34 CFR, the LEA and RESA assure that neither the LEA/RESA nor its principals are presently debarred or suspended from participation in programs by any federal agency.
