

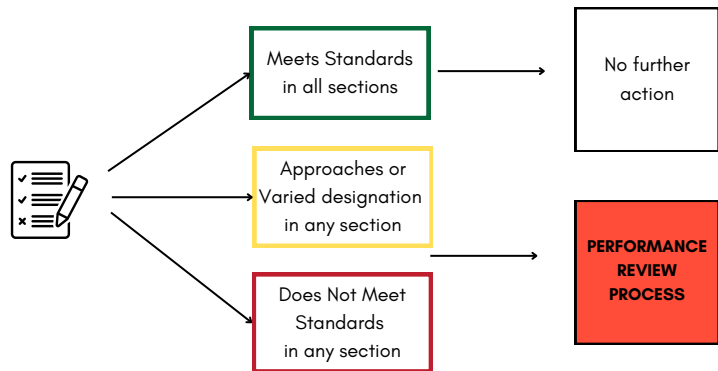


ANNUAL PERFORMANCE REVIEW PROCESS

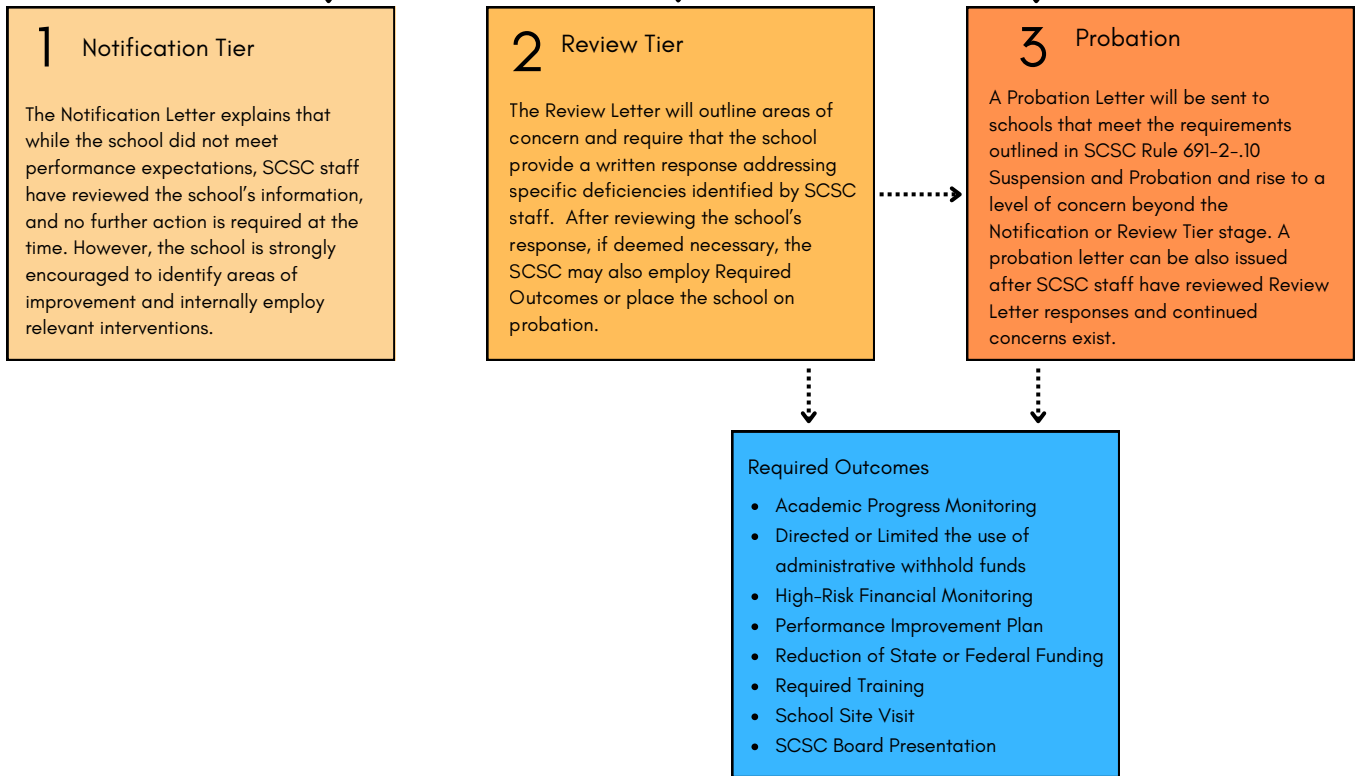
Summary Overview

CPF REPORT

The SCSC utilizes a Comprehensive Performance Framework (CPF) to annually assess each state charter school in the areas of academic achievement, financial viability, and operational compliance. State charter schools earn a "Exceeds", "Meets", "Approaches", "Varied", or "Does Not Meet" standards designation in each section of the CPF- academics, finances and operations.



PERFORMANCE REVIEW PROCESS
 If a school meets or exceeds standards in all sections of the the CPF, no further action is required. However, if a school earns an "Approaches", "Varied", or "Does Not Meet" designation in any section of the CPF , it is subject to the performance review process. SCSC staff will review the school's performance and issue it one of the three tiered letters noted in the chart below.



TIMELINE



The annual performance review process begins each year once CPF reports are final and ends once all Review Letter responses, Required Outcomes documentation and Probation Corrective Action Plans (CAPs) are submitted and approved. Review Letter responses, Required Outcomes documentation and Probation CAPs are due 30 days from the letter send date.

- If circumstances warrant such placement, schools can be placed on Probation or be required to implement any of the actions in the Possible Interventions list at any time, even outside of the performance review process and timeline.
