Charter Renewal Recommendation for Genesis Innovation Academy for Boys

Recommendation

SCSC staff recommends that the SCSC Board of Commissioners approve the renewal application for Genesis Innovation Academy for Boys by authorizing the SCSC Chair to execute a 5- year charter contract for the continued operation of a state charter school.

Rationale

Genesis Innovation Academy for Boys (GIA Boys) is completing its first 5- year charter contract with a 1- year COVID extension. GIA Boys met the eligibility requirements for a standard 5- year renewal by academically outperforming the schools its students would otherwise attend and meeting financial and operational standards as established by the Comprehensive Performance Framework for a majority of the current charter term.

All evidence indicates the school will continue to operate as a high-quality charter school consistent with the SCSC's mission and the educational goals of Georgia.

RENEWAL POSITION

School Model: Genesis Innovation Academy for Boys (GIA Boys)'s mission is to "create the next generation of path-breaking innovators who lead and serve with committed purpose, passion, discipline, and integrity". GIA Boys is a single-gender academy that seeks to provide a rigorous college preparatory program that addresses the unique needs of boys. The instructional approach focuses on engaging students in the relevant and innovative application of core content in project-based, real-world contexts with interdisciplinary fields of Engineering (STEM), Ethics, Economics, and Entrepreneurship integrated into curricular frameworks.

Academic Performance: GIA Boys met academic standards for a majority of the charter term, meaning it provides a better educational option than the schools its students would otherwise attend. In the 2018-2019 school year, GIA Boys outperformed on CCRPI Grade Band and Progress scores in both grade bands. In 2020-2021 and 2021-2022, the school outperformed on Achievement and Content Mastery measures (growth measures are not currently available), thus demonstrating the ability to grow students and increase academic proficiency.

Financial Performance: Although it failed to meet standards in its first year of operations, GIA Boys has since consistently met financial standards, demonstrating financial viability. The school typically meets standards across both short-term and sustainability measures and consistently submits its annual independent financial audit before the required deadline.

Operational Performance: Although it failed to meet standards in its first year of operations, GIA Boys has since consistently met operational standards. The school employs appropriate governance policies, attends required trainings, creates a safe and healthy learning environment, protects student and employees' rights, and executes an educational program that aligns with state requirements and charter contract expectations.

Additional Information: GIA Boys is seeking to slightly modify the wording of its mission, essential and innovative features, and mission specific goals; however, still focusing on cultivating students to be innovators who maximize their gifts, pursue their passion, and lead with uncompromising discipline and integrity. The school is currently approved to serve grades K-12; however, due to facility limitations it currently only serves K-8. The school is actively engaging a real-estate project management team to secure a facility and it expects to re-launch high school in the 2024-2025 school year.

Resurgence Hall Charter School (Resurgence Hall) is completing its first 5- year charter contract with a 1- year COVID extension. Resurgence Hall met the eligibility requirements for a standard 5- year renewal by academically outperforming the schools its students would otherwise attend every year of the charter term and meeting financial and operational standards for a majority of the charter term as established by the Comprehensive Performance Framework. All evidence indicates the school will continue to operate as a high-quality charter school consistent with the SCSC's mission and the educational goals of Georgia.

RESURGENCE HALL CHARTER SCHOOL

RENEWAL POSITION

School Model: The school's mission is to "educate every K-8 student for success in high school, college and life." Resurgence Hall offers an educational program emphasizing computer science, design thinking, and literacy. Further, it provides extended daily literacy instruction using a two-teacher push-in literacy model. The school's charter reflects blended learning, an extended day, and an extended year as additional innovations.

Academic Performance: Resurgence Hall consistently outperforms its comparison zone across all accountability metrics (CCRPI Content Mastery, Progress, Grade Band Score, VAM and BTO), meaning it provides a better educational option for students in both achievement and growth measures. In 2018-19, the most recent year for which all CCRPI data is available, Resurgence Hall's overall performance was higher than 95% of schools in the state. The school outperformed the schools from which its students are zoned to attend by about 40 points, according to GaDOE Achievement data for the 2020-21 school year and CCRPI Content Mastery data for the 2021-2022 school year.

Financial Performance: Resurgence Hall consistently meets financial expectations and demonstrates a financially viable track record. The school typically meets standards across most financial metrics, both short-term and sustainability, and consistently submits its annual independent financial audit before the required deadline.

Operational Performance: Resurgence Hall met operational standards in the first four years of the charter term. In the 2021-2022 school year, the school's federal program monitoring revealed numerous noncompliance issues resulting in a loss of points across several measures. Additionally, Resurgence Hall often struggles to meet the Georgia Dept. of Education data collections deadlines. However, the school willingly works to correct identified issues.

Additional Information: The school's excellent performance has been recognized by its community and charter growth funders. As such, Resurgence Hall replicated its school model and opened a middle grades academy this year (2022-2023 school year). The school is requesting to amend its grades served from K-8 to K-4. The original school plans to operate as a lower grades academy that feeds into the new middle grades academy that serves grades 5-8. Thus, Resurgence Hall would like to update the contract to reflect the correct grades served. The replication middle school is located in the same general area (southwest Atlanta, Fulton County) and has a statewide attendance zone, offering students throughout the state the opportunity to attend.

Scintilla Charter Academy (SCA) is completing an abbreviated 2- year charter contract with a 1year COVID extension. SCA met the eligibility requirements for a standard 5- year renewal by academically outperforming the schools its students would otherwise attend and meeting financial and operational standards as established by the Comprehensive Performance Framework for a majority of the current charter term.

All evidence indicates the school will continue to operate as a high-quality charter school consistent with the SCSC's mission and the educational goals of Georgia.

RENEWAL POSITION

School Model: The school's mission is to "nurture a diverse group of students to become lifelong, active participants in their own education, develop a sense of self and community, and become responsible and compassionate members of society". SCA offers an educational program focused on problem-solving, critical thinking, written and oral communication, research and collaboration. Further, it emphasizes collaborative teaching across subjects and grade levels to allow educators to develop deeper relationships with students and families. The school plans to adjust some elements of its mission, essential and innovative features, and mission-specific goals upon renewal; however, it will still provide an innovative and engaging environment with a focus on problem-solving, critical thinking, written and oral communication, research, and collaboration.

Academic Performance: SCA struggled to meet SCSC academic standards in its first charter term. However, in the last few years, student performance has drastically improved. The school made efforts to ensure its teachers had appropriate professional development and implemented a new benchmark assessment system ensuring alignment with the Georgia Standards of Excellence. The school outperformed the schools from which its students are zoned to attend by 30 points in the elementary grades and 20 points in the middle grades, according to GaDOE Achievement data for the 2020-21 school year and CCRPI Content Mastery data for the 2021-2022 school year.

Financial Performance: SCA struggled to meet financial expectations in its first charter term primarily due to its facility debt. However, it consistently worked to improve its score and has met financial standards in the most recent years of the current charter term, demonstrating a financially viable track record.

Operational Performance: SCA has consistently meets operational expectations. The school employs appropriate governance policies, attends required trainings, creates a safe and healthy learning environment, protects student and employees' rights, and executes an educational program that aligns with state requirements and charter contract expectations.

Additional Information: SCA has expanded into serving 6-8th grades in the last three years. The school is requesting to serve high school grades upon renewal. They plan to start serving 9th grade in the 2023-2024 school year and add one grade each year until they are fully enrolled. This would allow the current 8th-grade students to matriculate in SCA through to graduation. SCA leadership and board members presented a comprehensive expansion plan that included a financially viable budget. The school's current track record of performance, expansion plan, and related documents suggest it will provide a stable and successful high school program.

Recommendation

SCSC staff recommends that the SCSC Board of Commissioners approve the renewal application for SAIL- School for Arts Infused Learning by authorizing the SCSC Chair to execute a 5- year charter contract for the continued operation of a state charter school with an increased enrollment limit.

Rationale

SAIL- School for Arts Infused Learning (SAIL) is completing its first 5- year charter contract with a 1- year COVID extension. SAIL met the eligibility requirements for a standard 5- year renewal by meeting financial standards in the last year of the initial charter term and by academically outperforming the schools its students would otherwise attend and meeting operational standards as established by the Comprehensive Performance Framework for a majority of the current charter term.

All evidence indicates the school will continue to operate as a high-quality charter school consistent with the SCSC's mission and the educational goals of Georgia.

SAIL- School for Arts-Infused Learning (SAIL) is completing its first charter term, which includes a one-year COVID extension. The school met standards for a majority of the charter term in the academics and operations section of the performance framework. Although the school did not meet financial standards in 2021-2022, the one-year COVID extension was only meant to benefit schools. If the school had gone through the renewal process last year, within the terms of its original contract, it would have met the requisite financial standards for a 5-year renewal.

SAIL- SCHOOL FOR ARTS-INFUSED LEARNING

RENEWAL POSITION

School Model

SAIL- School for Arts-Infused Learning (SAIL)'s mission is to "provide an engaging and rigorous educational experience through the infusion of the arts and the academic core." SAIL offers a robust fine arts program with music, art, drama, and dance to all students in every grade. Specialists in each field utilize the arts to draw connections with real-world experiences. Further, the school offers foreign language instruction to all students daily, physical education for students multiple times a week, multiple-year looping, and problem-solving lessons using technology. The school has a statewide attendance zone; however, a majority (about 78%) of SAIL's students are zoned to attend Columbia County Schools, the county in which the school is located.

Academic Performance

SAIL met academic standards for the first three years of the charter term for which data are available. The school met standards via the Single Score measure, which combines CCRPI grade band scores based on grade band enrollment. The school typically outperforms in the elementary-grade band but, in comparison, struggles in the middle-grade band. Based on 2021-2022 GaDOE CCRPI Content Mastery data, SAIL did not outperform the schools and districts it serves in either grade band. The school fell three points below the comparison score in the elementary-grade band and about ten points below in the middle-grade band. In the school's renewal application, SAIL noted it has engaged in professional development for upper grades teachers and hired an instructional coach to support them as well.

Financial Performance

SAIL struggled to meet financial expectations in the first few years of its charter term primarily due to its facility debt. It has failed to meet the financial sustainability measures, specifically the Debt to Asset Ratio. However, in 2020-2021 the school had a 99% Debt to Asset Ratio, earning it partial points on that measure and resulting in a Meeting standards designation. However, in 2021-2022 the school earned zero (0) points on the Debt to Income and Debt to Asset Ratio measures. According to the independent financial audit, SAIL refinanced its debt through a bond deal. Although the transaction result should decrease *future* debt service payments, the fees associated with the deal increased the school's FY22 debt as measured by its FY22 audit. This resulted in the loss of points on both debt measures and, ultimately, a Does Not Meet standards designation.

Operational Performance

SAIL consistently met operational expectations in the first three years of the charter term. The school employs appropriate governance policies, attends required trainings, creates a safe and healthy learning environment, protects student and employees' rights, and executes an educational program that aligns with state requirements and charter contract expectations. However, in the two most recent years, SAIL has lost points related to financial oversight.



Enrollment Limit Expansion

SAIL serves students in grades K-8 and requests to increase its enrollment limit from 594 to 804 upon renewal. The school has a robust waitlist in each grade level, 746 students total, demonstrating the high demand for the school in a geographic area that lacks other choice options. Growth would begin in FY24 by adding 1-2 additional classrooms in each grade. SAIL presented a plan to hire and onboard new teachers and related support staff in accordance with the increased enrollment. SAIL plans to purchase new modular units to accommodate more students and classrooms and is working with its bondholder to ensure the growth results in long-term financial sustainability. The school acknowledges the need to be strategic with a continued focus on improving academic performance and financial viability while increasing enrollment.
