The Carl Vinson Institute of Government Charter Schools Financial Management Certification equips participants with the unique skills and knowledge needed to financially operate a charter school. The Payroll course will focus on the following topics of the payroll process: Fair Labor Standards Act, new employee documentation, compensation calculation through the W-2 process, benefits including insurance and pensions, payroll taxes and remittances, payroll deductions, reporting and recording payroll, internal controls related to payroll, and payroll resources. The Purchasing course will focus on topics important to the purchasing process, from determining needs to receipt of purchased goods and services. FY 2017 Austerity Reduction Survey

The GaDOE is conducting a survey on behalf of the Governor's Office and the General Assembly related to how funds for the FY 2017 Austerity Reduction will be utilized (an increase of \$300 million in the FY 2017 Appropriations Act). The legislative intent of the additional funding is described as follows:

"Increase funds to offset the austerity reduction in order to provide local education authorities the flexibility to eliminate teacher furlough days, increase instructional days, and increase teacher salaries."

GaDOE is asking districts to complete the following survey by **August 26, 2016**. GaDOE will assemble the information and obtain clarifications before submitting the information to the Governor's Office and General Assembly. After completing the report by the first week in September, GaDOE will share the results with all districts who participate in the survey.

Science Georgia Standards of Excellence Support Webinars

The State Board of Education adopted the Science Georgia Standards of Excellence (GSE) on March 31, 2016. The Science GSE will be implemented beginning in school year 2017-2018. US Ed Guidance on Serving All Students

The US Department of Education has released new guidance on serving students with disabilities and homeless students.

August 11, the Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services issued guidance to clarify some of the specific requirements in Part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) that apply to public virtual schools. The guidance addresses states' general supervision responsibilities regarding virtual schools and the applicability of IDEA's child find provisions to children attending such schools. It further outlines the responsibility for the provision of a free appropriate public education (FAPE) to students with disabilities attending such schools (press release and blog post). issued guidance to clarify some of the specific requirements in Part B of the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act* (IDEA) that apply to public virtual schools.

US Ed also released <u>guidance</u> to states and districts on new provisions in the *Every Student Succeeds Act* (ESSA) for supporting students experiencing homelessness. The guidance aims to assist state and local partners in understanding and implementing the new law in order to better protect and serve children and youth affected by homelessness and help schools in providing these students with much needed stability, safety, and support. It was informed by input from diverse stakeholders consulted during the development of the resource (letter on guidance and press call audio).

Zika Virus Response Planning Webinar

The *Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)* and the *United States Department of Education* will host "Zika Virus Response Planning: What School Administrators Need to Know" on Friday, August 19 from 1:30-2:30 PM EST. This webinar will address questions regarding the CDC's guidance *Zika Virus Response Planning: Interim Guidance for District and School Administrators in the Continental United States and Hawaii,* and how schools can prepare for potential cases of Zika. The webinar will cover the basics of Zika, roles and responsibilities of school officials and public health authorities, planning for possible Zika transmission in K-12 schools, school preparations for mosquito-borne transmission of Zika in local areas, and considerations for child care, camp, and higher education settings.
