Petitioner Boot Camp

January 20, 2016, Macon Marriott Conference Center, Macon, Georgia Invited: Potential SCSC Petitioners

The Petitioner Boot Camp prepares potential petitioners for the SCSC charter petition process. On the first day, attendees will learn what goes into a successful charter petition, with a specific focus on timeline, legal requirements, and proper board governance. Attendees will also hear directly from existing state charter schools and have the opportunity to ask questions of existing schools and SCSC staff. The SCSC will also offer a series of webinars for petitioners in early 2016 focused on budget preparation and school finance.

Governance Training

Georgia law, O.C.G.A. § 20-2-2084(f), requires every member of a governing board of a state charter school to participate in annual governing board training. For FY16, state charter school governing board members may fulfill this obligation by one of two methods.

- 1. State charter school governing board members may attend one of the two governing board training opportunities provided to state charters by the SCSC *at no charge*; or
- State charter school governing board members <u>may use their own funds</u> to contract for a minimum of 12 contact hours of training from a provider that is approved by the State Board of Education to deliver governance training to charter schools. Training content must reflect the topics covered at the SCSC Governance Training. Review the <u>SCSC Guidance on Governance Training</u> for a complete list of requirements and to ensure compliance.

The SCSC strongly encourages state charter school governing board members to attend one of the governance trainings conducted by the SCSC as these trainings provide board members the unique opportunity to discuss issues and concerns directly with their authorizer. Further, the SCSC staff's unique understanding of the compliance issues facing state charter schools ensures that SCSC training sessions are always topical, relevant, and timely.

The Carl Vinson Institute of Government Charter Schools Financial Management Certification is a six-course series that equips participants with the unique skills and knowledge needed to financially operate a charter school. The Introductory Accounting course will introduce the participant to basic accounting concepts for governmental funds. Topics covered will include the accounting equation, chart of accounts, double entry accounting, accounting systems and records, fund accounting, basis of accounting, and payroll and benefit accounting.
