#### Charter Schools Financial Management Certification Program

#### Introductory Accounting February 25-27, 2015 Atlanta, Georgia Invited: School Business Managers and Administrators

The SCSC will offer a full scholarship to state charter business managers and/or administrators who wish to enroll in the Carl Vinson Institute of Government's Charter Schools Financial Management Certification Program. Courses must be completed within a three-year period. The Introductory Accounting course will introduce participants to basic accounting concepts for governmental funds. Topics covered include – accounting equation, chart of accounts, double entry

accounting, accounting systems and records, fund accounting, basis of accounting, payroll and benefit accounting, and case study. Visit the SCSC website to see the full program overview.

#### Budgeting and Purchasing for Charter Schools May 6-7, 2015 Atlanta, Georgia Invited: School Business Managers and Administrators

This course is part of the CVIOG Financial Management Certification and will focus on roles of the board and staff in budgeting, budget preparation process, estimating revenues and expenditures, projection of ending fund balance, and justification of budget to funding authorities and board. Budget administration, long term financial planning, and the Quality Basic Education funding formula will also be discussed. The Purchasing course will focus on topics important to the purchasing process, from determining needs to receipt of purchased goods and services. Also discussed are alternative purchasing methods, required documentation, and ethics. Visit the SCSC website to see the full program overview.

#### **Student Information Systems**

All charter schools authorized by the SCSC should utilize student information systems (SIS) that are compatible with Georgia's Statewide Longitudinal Data System (SLDS). Schools authorized by the SCSC after April 2013 are required to utilize an SIS that is compatible with the SLDS as a condition of their charter contracts. There are many vendors that offer SIS products that are compatible with the SLDS. All vendors currently used by local school districts are compatible with the SLDS. A map illustrating the vendors used by local school districts is available <u>here</u>. Other vendors may be compatible. If you are unsure whether an SIS product is compatible, please contact the Georgia Department of Education's Technology Services Division <u>here</u>.

State charter schools are also encouraged to utilize SIS products that are compatible with the Georgia Online IEP program (GO-IEP) offered through the Georgia Department of Education. This access will help schools with special education compliance. Systems known to be compatible with GO-IEP are: Infinite Campus, Powerschool, Schoolmax, and Aspen. # Paid Lunch Equity (PLE) Exemption:

As you may be aware, USDA Memo SP 19-2015 extends the availability for exemption from the Paid Lunch Equity (PLE) requirement through FY 2015-2016 & FY 2016-2017 for School Food Authorities (SFAs) in strong financial standing and six cents certified. In order to be exempted, SFAs are required to submit a request for exemption and certain records to the State Agency for evaluation. A request for exemption will be granted if the SFA is six cents certified and can demonstrate that the required increase to paid lunch prices or revenue contributions will cause the SFA to exceed the 3 month average operating balance limit.

To enable the State Agency (SA) to evaluate and approve your request for exemption, please submit your request to Vanessa Haigler at: <u>vhaigler@doe.k12.ga.us</u> **on or before May 31, 2015**. Also, attach any other records that may be helpful in justifying the decision for an exemption. You may scan and email the completed form and records.

#### **GaDOE Facilities Division Bond and Construction Questionnaires**

The GaDOE Facilities Services Unit recently sent an email to district superintendents regarding Bond and Construction Questionnaires. As state charter school do not participate in the capital outlay program, <u>state charters are NOT required</u> to complete the questionnaires.

### **GaDOE Student Learning Objectives State Exemplars**

The SLO team is requesting feedback regarding the State Exemplars. Please submit any suggestions or identified revisions using the link below by Friday, March 20, 2015. District feedback is critical to ensure appropriate vetting of the assessments. An additional level of review is also being conducted by Southwest Educational Development Laboratory (SEDL), an external education research group. The recommendations from districts and SEDL will guide the refinement of the exemplars and corrections will be completed prior to July 2015. #### Food Recall

Please be advised that Goya Foods, Inc. has recalled certain lots of Kirby brand black beans with creole seasoning, 29 oz. size and Goya brand black bean soup, 29 oz. size. The voluntary recall was announced after the Company was notified by one of its ingredient suppliers that one lot of ground cumin had potentially been produced with undeclared peanut protein. #### CharterLeader Program Georgia Charter Schools Association

The Georgia Charter Schools Association's (GCSA) CharterLeader program is launching a new cohort, beginning in February 2015 and running through June 2015. The program equips current and aspiring leaders in charter schools to develop the skills and core competencies to launch, lead, convert, replicate, and/or expand high quality schools. The CharterLeader training is an opportunity to receive 10 Professional Learning Units (PLUs).

The total program cost is \$3,000. Participants or schools will be required to pay in two installments of \$1,500 in both February and May, 2015 before being issued a completion certificate. Applications for the 2015 cohort are due by Friday, February 6, 2015.
