SCSC Meetings

The last monthly State Charter Schools Commission was held on June 29, 2016. The June meeting minutes are available here. 2016 Petition Cycle Update

Applications for the 2016 petition cycle were due in May. Petition review panels comprised of SCSC staff, commissioners, and expert third party reviewers in the fields of finance, education, law, and policy will review eligible petitions, interview petitioners, and make recommendations for approval or denial to the Commission. The full Commission is tentatively scheduled to vote on recommendations in August. All schools are required to implement the Teacher and Leader Keys Effectiveness Systems to evaluate school administrators and teachers (TKES and LKES). To conduct the evaluations, representatives from the school must receive training and credentialing. The SCSC has worked with the GaDOE to schedule an initial training and credentialing session for new state charter schools and newly hired staff at existing state charter schools this summer.

State charters should send the individuals from their schools who will be charged with conducting TKES/LKES evaluations to this training. The SCSC recommends that at least two individuals become credentialed to conduct TKES evaluations (evaluations of teachers) and that two individuals become credentialed to conduct LKES evaluations (evaluations of school leaders). Generally, school administrators are charged with conducting TKES evaluations, and the principal and a board member are charged with conducting LKES evaluations. <u>Charter Schools Financial Management Certification:</u> <u>Internal Controls and Budgeting</u>

July 26 – July 27, 2016 Georgia Administrative Office of the Courts, Atlanta, Georgia

The Carl Vinson Institute of Government Charter Schools Financial Management Certification equips participants with the unique skills and knowledge needed to financially operate a charter school. The Internal Controls course will introduce the participant to the five components of internal controls: control environment, risk assessment, control activities, information and communication and monitoring. Discussion will include the importance of internal controls for charter schools including high risk areas charter schools should consider. The Budgeting course will focus on roles of the board and staff in budgeting, budget preparation process, estimating revenues and expenditures, projection of ending fund balance, and justification of budget to funding authorities and board. Budget administration, long term financial planning, and the Quality Basic Education funding formula will also be discussed. Find more information, including the full course calendar, here.

GaDOE FY17 Facilities Grants

The GaDOE FY17 Charter School Facilities Grant Application is now available and was emailed by the GaDOE Charter Division directly to operational schools. The Facilities Grant is an opportunity for eligible charter schools to compete for grants of up to \$200,000 in state funds to be used on costs of certain facility and transportation needs.

Deadline to Establish Eligibility: Friday, July 22, 2016

Application Deadline: Friday, August 12, 2016

Applicant Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible to apply for an FY17 Charter School Facilities Grant, a school must have met the following three requirements:

- 1. Opened in 2013 or before.
- 2. Beats the Odds in 2014-15.
- 3. Filed with GaDOE an FY15 audit report for its Georgia nonprofit corporation along with its Annual Report by November
- 1, 2015, and must not have an "Adverse or Disclaimer Opinion" or "No Opinion" in its audit report.

Legislative Changes

Along with sweltering heat and humidity, July in Georgia brings effective dates of enacted legislation. Two bills are of particular importance to state charter schools and the SCSC:

HB 65 creates O.C.G.A. § 20-2-167.1 that requires local education agencies, including state charter schools, to hold at least two public meeting to provide an opportunity for public input on its annual operating budget before the board may approve the operational budget. The new law also requires a summary of the annual operating budget that was proposed and adopted by the governing board to be posted on a publicly available area of the school's website. The law contains specific details for conducting the public budget meetings for schools that have a statewide attendance zone as well as requirements for advertising the meetings. Note: As the law went into effect on July 1, 2016, if state charter school governing board adopted its FY17 budget prior to July 1, the school did not need to conduct the two public meetings. However, if the governing board did not adopt its budget prior to July 1, the school must comply will all aspects of O.C.G.A. § 20-2-167.1 to ensure full compliance with the law.

• HB 895 amends two laws that pertain to SCSC governance trainings. The SCSC governance training requirements must include two to three hours annually regarding sound fiscal management and monitoring the implementation of school budgets. The SCSC will implement these requirements with its FY17 training program requirements and will provide additional detail regarding training program options in the coming weeks. HB 895 also requires the SCSC to establish a charter schools financial management certification program for state charter school leaders and financial officials. The language of HB 895 requires the SCSC to establish this program, and while it is strongly encouraged, the language of the bill does not specifically require schools to utilize the program. The SCSC is implementing this aspect of the law through the fincial management certification program offered through the Carl Vinson Institute of Government. Please note that other legislative changes will likely affect the operations of state charter schools, including, but not limited to, <u>SB 364</u> that amended the several provisions of law relating to teacher and leader evaluations as well as the federal <u>transition to the Every Student Succeeds Act</u>. The SCSC will provide key guidance as quickly as it is able, but schools are strongly encouraged to consult their school board attorneys for specific requirements of applicable law.

2015-2016 Citizen and Immigration Status Report

State charter schools must comply with statutory hiring preferences outlined in O.C.G.A. § 20-2-2084(d)(1). In short, state charter schools must provide a hiring preference to individuals, other than foreign exchange teachers, who are citizens or nationals of the United States over other individuals who are not citizens or nationals of the United States if two individuals are equally qualified. State charter schools must also seek prior approval from the SCSC when seeking to hire an individual who is not a citizen or national of the United States or a protected individual as defined in 8 U.S.C. § 1324b, unless the teacher is a foreign exchange teacher.

The SCSC is charged by law to review the citizen and immigration statuses of individuals employed by state charter schools to monitor compliance with O.C.G.A. § 20-2-2084(d)(1). Accordingly, if your state charter school employed individuals in the 2015-2016 school year who are not citizens, U.S. nationals, or protected individuals as defined in 8 U.S.C. § 1324b, please return the required form to Gregg Stevens by August 15, 2016.

If your state charter school only employed individuals in the 2015-2016 school year who are citizens, U.S. nationals, or protected individuals, as defined in 8 U.S.C. § 1324b, please email Gregg Stevens by August 15, 2016, stating, "[Name of State Charter School] only employed individuals in the 2015-2016 school year who are citizens, U.S. nationals, or protected individuals, as defined in 8 U.S.C. § 1324b."

Changes to Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS) Program

Beginning in FY17, school systems that provide before and after school programs to students whose families receive federal child care subsidies must comply with new federal requirements in order to continue receiving payment for those before and after school services.

The new federal requirements are 1) Health and Safety Orientation Training, and 2) Annual Monitoring/Posting of Inspections. As the state agency that administers the CAPS program in Georgia, the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL) is responsible for monitoring programs in which students receiving subsidized before/after school care are enrolled. Beginning October 1, 2016, DECAL consultants will visit these programs annually to confirm compliance with requirements.

FY17 Innovation Fund Grant Opportunities Governor's Office of Student Achievement

The Innovation Fund supports local education agencies (LEAs), regional education service agencies (RESAs) (on behalf of a group of schools or LEAs), traditional public schools and charter schools in planning, implementing, and scaling innovative education programs that advance student achievement throughout Georgia. Recently, Governor Deal appropriated state funding for Fiscal Year 2017 to provide new grant opportunities. The funding priorities for these grants include the following:

- Applied Learning with a Focus on STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering. Arts, and Mathematics) Education,
- Birth to Age Eight Language and Literacy Development,
- Development and Replication of Blended Learning School Models, and
- Teacher and Leader Development for High-Need Schools.
