Governance Training

Georgia law, O.C.G.A. § 20-2-2084(f), requires every member of a governing board of a state charter school to participate in annual governing board training. For FY16, state charter school governing board members may fulfill this obligation by one of two methods.

- 1. State charter school governing board members may attend one of the two governing board training opportunities provided to state charters by the SCSC <u>at no charge</u>; or
- 2. State charter school governing board members <u>may use their own funds</u> to contract for a minimum of 12 contact hours of training from a provider that is approved by the State Board of Education to deliver governance training to charter schools. Training content must reflect the topics covered at the SCSC Governance Training. Review the <u>SCSC Guidance on Governance Training</u> for a complete list of requirements and to ensure compliance.

The SCSC strongly encourages state charter school governing board members to attend one of the governance trainings conducted by the SCSC as these trainings provide board members the unique opportunity to discuss issues and concerns directly with their authorizer. Further, the SCSC staff's unique understanding of the compliance issues facing state charter schools ensures that SCSC training sessions are always topical, relevant, and timely.

SCSC staff and other presenters will review the SCSC Pre-Opening Checklist and share critical information on human resources, facilities, Title programs, special education requirements, the Teacher and Leader Keys Effectiveness Systems (TKES/LKES), and student recruitment and marketing strategies, among other topics. Newly hired state charter leaders and newly elected governing board chairs are also invited to attend.

Petitioner Boot Camp

The Petitioner Boot Camp prepares potential petitioners for the SCSC charter petition process. Attendees will also hear directly from existing state charter schools and have the opportunity to ask questions of existing schools and SCSC staff. The SCSC will also offer a series of webinars for petitioners in early 2016 focused on budget preparation and school finance for those who cannot attend the Day two budget boot camp in Atlanta.

Suicide Prevention Training

The State Board of Education recently passed Board Rule 160-4-8-.19 *Suicide Prevention Training Requirement For Certificated School System Personnel* to implement the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 20-2-779.1. Because both Board Rule 160-4-8-.19 and O.C.G.A. § 20-2-779.1 relate to the health and safety of students, state charter schools do not have flexibility from their requirements. All certificated employees in a state charter school must receive annual training in suicide awareness and prevention. Employees may fulfill the training requirement through trainings offered by the Georgia Department of Education or through state charter schools or local school systems utilizing the training materials approved by the Georgia Department of Education. Additionally, all state charter schools must adopt a policy on student suicide prevention that are developed in consultation with school and community stakeholders, school employed mental health professionals, and suicide prevention experts. At a minimum, state charter school suicide prevention policies must relate to suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention. The Georgia Department of Education developed a model policy to assist school systems in developing individual policies that is available here.

Math and Science Supplement

As a reminder, state charter schools that employ teachers who are certified in mathematics or science by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission and teach in those areas receive additional funding for the salary of those teachers. While state charter schools have the flexibility to set compensation for individual teachers without regard to the state salary schedule, additional funding received by a school pursuant to the Math and Science Teacher Supplement must be provided to the teachers who earned that funding. Georgia law provides that math and science supplements are paid by the Georgia Department of Education through the LEA that employs the teacher, but O.C.G.A. § 20-2-212.5_clearly identifies that the funding is a property right of the teacher. As the funding is property of the teacher, a state charter school must not utilize that funding for any other purpose. A state charter school that does not provide the Math and Science Supplement to teachers that earned that compensation is violating the rights of the teachers in violation of O.C.G.A. § 20-2-2065(b)(5).

Each state charter school that receives additional funding through the Math and Science Teacher Supplement will receive a report from the Georgia Department of Education that identifies the teachers who earned the additional compensation and the amount of compensation each individual earned. It is the responsibility of the state charter school to ensure that each teacher receives the additional compensation to which he or she is entitled. As the Math and Science Teacher Supplement is made available to schools in the fiscal year after it is earned by employees, it is possible that a state charter school may receive funding for a teacher that is no longer employed by the school. In such cases, the state charter school must locate the former employee to provide him or her the additional compensation he or she earned.

Teacher and Leader Keys Effectiveness Systems Training for State Charter Schools Georgia Department of Education

The GaDOE Division of Teacher and Leader Effectiveness has a new training to offer state charter administrators who have been implementing the Teacher Keys Evaluation Instrument for at least one year. <u>One participant</u> from each Charter is invited to register on both the Electronic Platform (directions attached) <u>and</u> with Middle Georgia RESA. The purpose is to provide additional support around inter-rater reliability. Therefore, we are offering a three-day training entitled, *Evaluation Instrument on Inter-Rater Reliability*, to assist evaluators with their observation skills and accuracy. There will be particular emphasis on an evaluator's objective collection of evidence during the observation of teacher classroom performance. At the conclusion of the three day training, each participant will view a video and rate a teacher's performance using our Georgia TAPS and the associated performance appraisal rubrics. <u>Each participant's scores will be analyzed to determine degrees of rater-reliability, and the participant will receive a subsequent score report.</u>

As a follow up, please note that after the training, these reports should be saved as a PDF and uploaded in each participating evaluator's LKES plan. Trainers will ensure these documents are uploaded into the TLE Electronic Platform on site at the training. Charter School Evaluators of Administrators (LKES) who attend should consider this information as an additional source of documentation to inform professional development, as well as evidence in the LKES evaluation that the participant has engaged in additional training to improve evaluation skills. <u>Additional professional development</u> and training will be offered in the event a participant's scores determine that follow-up is needed.
