SCSC 2014 Petition Cycle

Congratulations to Cirrus Academy Charter School, Du Bois Integrity Academy, and Scintilla Charter Academy! The SCSC voted to approve the petitions of these schools at the September meeting. The SCSC approved four schools at the August meeting, bringing the total number of school approvals in the 2014 petition cycle to seven schools. All seven schools plan to open for the 2015-16 school year.

Starting Strong: Best Practices in Starting a Charter School

An SCSC-commissioned report from Peabody College at Vanderbilt University focusing on academic and operational practices commonly employed by high performing start-up charter schools is now available <u>here</u>. The Vanderbilt research team studied charter schools in three states -- Georgia, Tennessee and Florida – and conducted interviews with leaders who work at Charter Support Organizations (CSOs) in Arizona, Colorado, Georgia, Florida, Louisiana, Michigan, New York,

Ohio, South Carolina, Tennessee and Washington DC. They also reviewed existing literature of best practices for charter school start-ups. The researchers categorized their findings into 11 domains of best practices, spanning all ranges of charter school start-up, from governance board composition to student recruitment and accountability. Among the findings, researchers noted that early school performance is a strong indicator for subsequent school performance, emphasizing the importance of "starting strong." The SCSC plans to share this report with petitioning groups, existing schools and other external stakeholders.

Charter Schools Financial Management Certification Program

GaDOE Austerity Survey

The GaDOE is conducting a survey on behalf of the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget and the General Assembly, related to how funds in the FY 2015 Austerity Reduction were utilized (a statewide increase of over \$314,357,555 in the FY 2015 State Appropriation). The intent of the additional funding was to offset the austerity reduction to provide LEAs the flexibility to eliminate furlough days, increase instructional days and increase teacher salaries.

It is very likely that future austerity reductions and methods of increasing K-12 funding, will be informed by information captured in this survey. With that in mind, please ensure that school staff members make a good faith effort to complete the report by **October 31, 2014.**

Georgia Department of Public Health: Ebola Virus Safety

The Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) has issues the following safety precautions for keeping your school community safe from possible spread of the Ebola virus.

(1) Be aware of students and their families, staff or teachers who have traveled to Ebola-affected West African countries, including Liberia, Sierra Leone, and Guinea within the previous 21 days.

(2) Know the signs and symptoms of Ebola, which may appear anywhere from 2 to 21 days after exposure to Ebola and include:

- Fever greater than 101.5°F
- Severe headache
- Muscle pain
- Weakness
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Abdominal pain
- Unexplained, unusual bleeding or bruising

(3) If someone presents to your school health clinic with a fever, immediately ask if they have traveled to or come into contact with someone who has traveled to an Ebola affected region.

(4) If you encounter individuals who you believe meet the case definition described in (1) and (2) or (3), separate the individual from others and report it to DPH at 1-866-PUB-HLTH or the DPH Epidemiology section at 404-657-2588.

(5) Hand washing is still the most effective method to protect you from the spread of infectious disease. DPH encourages schools to review their infection control policies and procedures with staff and reinforce germ stopping habits with students.
