Governance Training

Target Audience: Governing board members and school leaders

Georgia law, O.C.G.A. § 20-2-2084(f), requires every member of a governing board of a state charter school participate in annual governing board training. State charter school governing board members may attend one of the two governing board training opportunities provided to state charters by the SCSC at no charge to fulfill this obligation. The SCSC strongly encourages state charter school governing board members to attend one of the governance trainings conducted by the SCSC as these trainings provides board members the unique opportunity to discuss issues and concerns directly with their authorizer. The SCSC staff's unique understanding of the compliance issues facing state charter schools ensures that SCSC training sessions are always topical, relevant, and timely. Topics will include the roles and responsibilities of board members and administrators, the SCSC Comprehensive Performance Framework, school finance, legal obligations, among others.

Financial System Review

Target Audience: School Leadership

A representative from the Georgia Charter Schools Association will work with the school leader and financial management team to conduct an indepth financial system review of school financial policies and budgets. The review will assist schools in establishing or improving effective internal controls, implementing best practices for accounting practices and procedures, and will provide schools with an assessment of fiscal health.

Strategic Planning Services and Issue Resolution

Target Audience: Governing Board and School Leaders

A facilitator from the Carl Vinson Institute of Government will meet with the governing board to provide a one-day session for general strategic planning or issue resolution. The opportunity also includes two half-day check-in meetings with the facilitator on the school's progress.

NEWLY APPROVED SCHOOLS

These opportunities are specifically developed for approved state charter school petitioners that plan to open in the 2017-18 school year or later.



Approval Webinar

September 2017

The SCSC will host a webinar for representatives of newly approved charter schools to discuss expectations of boards throughout the planning year. SCSC staff will review the SCSC school opening checklist and provide an overview of available resources. The session will be recorded for those who are unable to attend and available on the <u>Training and Materials page of the SCSC website</u>.

Orientation

January 2018 – Atlanta, Georgia

This training is specifically developed to assist schools newly approved state charter schools with the tools and resources that they need for a successful planning year and school opening. SCSC staff and other presenters will review the SCSC Pre-Opening Checklist and share critical information on human resources, facilities, Title programs, special education requirements, the Teacher and Leader Keys Effectiveness Systems (TKES/LKES), and student recruitment and marketing strategies, among other topics.

PETITIONERS

These opportunities are specifically developed for individuals who wish to submit a charter petition to the SCSC or a local board of education.

Petitioner Boot Camps

September 28, 2017 – Georgia Tech Hotel & Conference Center

The Petitioner Boot Camp prepares potential petitioners for the SCSC charter petition process. Attendees will learn what goes into a successful charter petition, with a specific focus on timeline, legal requirements, board governance, financial controls, and budget preparation. Attendees will also hear directly from existing state charter schools and have the opportunity to ask questions of existing schools and SCSC staff.
